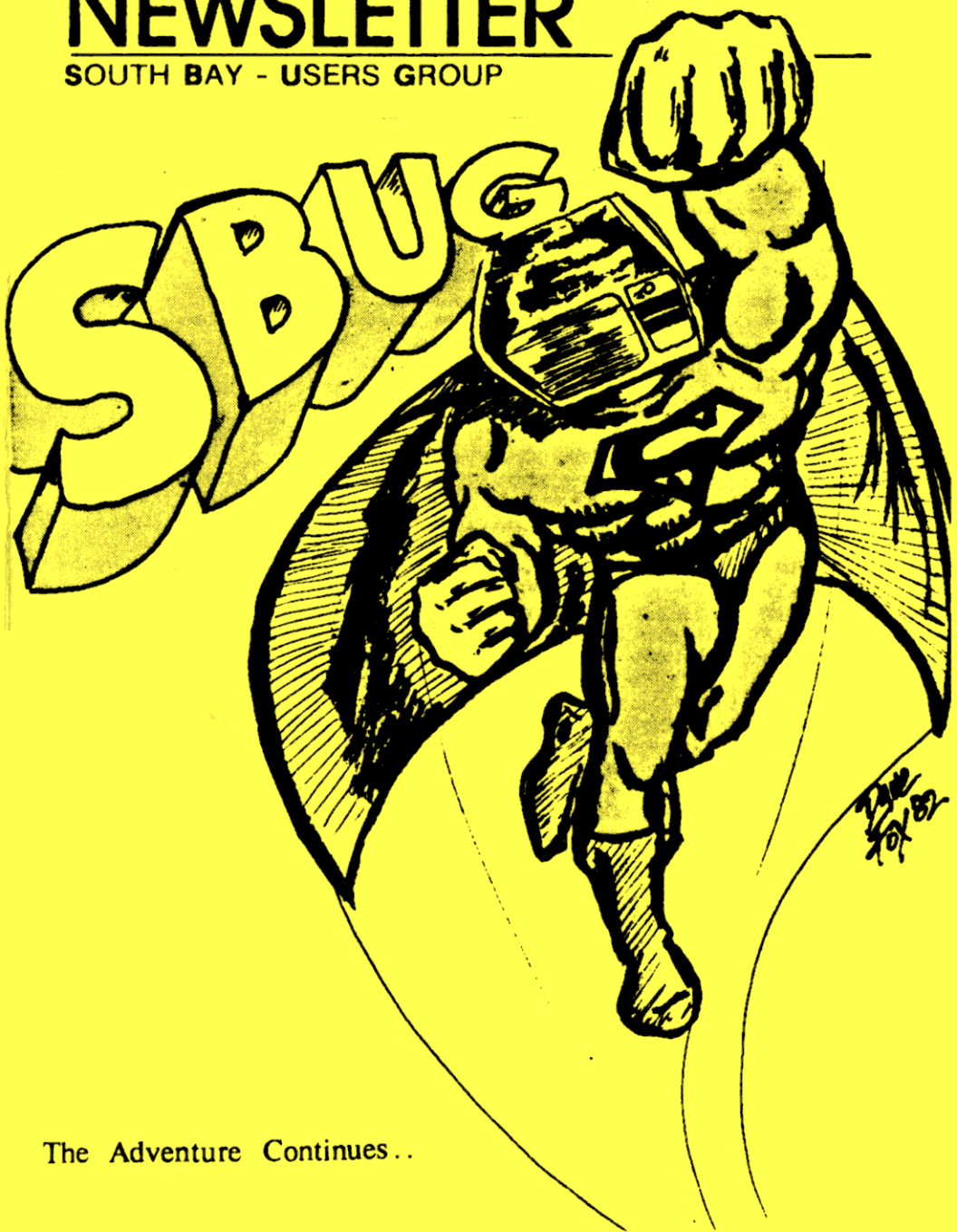

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PRINTING OF SBUG-80 MESSAGES

A number of people are interested in printing out information found on the SBUG-80 B.B.S., and wanted a way that was easy to clean up the unwanted and redundant material. The following procedure is one way to accomplish this goal, using the mail program as an example. Please bear with me as this sounds much harder than it really is.

After loading MODEM80 and connecting to SBUG-80 and going to the mail portion, hit <break> and select option <D>; then select option <3> and choose your filespec and drive number you want to save the file on. Then push the <clear> and <3> keys at the same time to get the message "SAVE TO FILE (ON)", by pushing the <clear> and <3> key again you will turn on/off the save function so you can get selective on what you want to save. Now, for the meat of the whole thing: after you finish collecting everything you want, hit <BREAK> and select option <D>, then option <5> to write and close the buffer. We're not done yet, but almost, like I said, this is harder to write about than to do, (I hope so, anyway). FINALLY, we get to the last part. Load Scripsit and then load your saved filespec, and edit and format to however you want the print-out to be. Hopefully, all this will become easy for you after a few tries, so don't give up. This way you can have a disk copy and a print-out of whatever you want. Good Luck, and happy printing.

NOTE -- Study and understand NEWDOS/80 CHAINING before attempting to use this chain file!!!!

This Chain File will configure your Model I/III to be compatible with almost any combination of disc drives that

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are currently available. The PDRIVE table must first be modified, 'TI=E' because I have an LNW type doubler, use the correct TI spec for your system. (i.e. 'TI=C' for the Percom Doubler) Use Scripsit's global search and replace function to make the modification easier.

Hi All:

I have been playing around with the Exatron MMB00 64K board for the TRS-80 Model I for about 2 months now. I have had nothing but trouble with it from the beginning. It seems as though it works well without a disk system, but nothing seems to work well with disks and an expansion interface. At first it would not work at all with the E/I connected. The Exatron personnel were not able to help, but I was able to get help from Sabri Kawash of SBUG who cut a trace in the E/I to disable the upper 32K so that they do not conflict with the MMB00 upper 32K. Now the board seems to work okay as a 48K machine with disks, but there are problems if I try to use the lower 12K by moving the ROM code into RAM. The computer hangs up if I try this from DOS. It works okay if the ROM/RAM program is executed from LEVEL 2 without DOS. However, even when ROM is loaded into RAM, the DOS does not work properly, with many syntax errors and lock-ups. The other feature of this board is a CPU speed-up. I found that a 100% speedup would not work at all on my computer, even with a Z80A (4MHz) chip and the 50% speedup passes the memory tests, but does not work reliably with NEWDOS/GO even with the SYSTEM modified for high speed.

As you can see, I am not too excited about this product for use with disk operating systems. It seems like disk is a dirty work at Exatron and they don't have anyone who can help when things don't work. I would like to sell my assembled and tested (?) version of the MMB00 board for what I have invested in it (about \$100) to anyone who wants it. It will probably work great for Stringy Floppy systems or other non-DOS uses. If anyone has had experience with using this board with DOS please let me
