

 THE EDITOR'S BYTES & BITES

The latest (August 20) issue of INFOWORLD has an in depth article on Radio Shack. This magazine has never been a Tandy enthusiast, but the article is well balanced in appraising Tandy strengths and weaknesses.

Your scribe has long scribbled that if we lock ourselves into proprietary operating systems we are missing most of what microcomputers have to offer. This applies of course to TRSDOS, NEWDOS, or Apple.

The computer world as now constituted has two principal operating systems, MSDOS and CP/M. All of us now have access to CP/M if we wish, if it's worth it to us. The INFOWORLD article strongly suggests that next year there will be a 16 bit board for the Model IV to run MSDOS. Don't you know there are hackers out there who will stick it with a hairpin, and wrap a wire clothes hanger around it so it will work on Models I & III?

In any case, welcome to the party, Tandy. A little late, but what the hell.

ELECTRIC PENCIL--A REVIEW

Before beginning this first of three articles on word processors, I want to make a general comment on the genre. It is generally conceded that in home computer applications, word processing leads the parade. Not every one has a budget, not every one does math, not every one bothers to balance his check book (what are banks for?), but most of us write, some more, some less.

For someone who has never seen word processing, the sight of a person moderately adept at their use, at work writing, causes gasps of astonishment. At times it has made me feel as though I had just pole vaulted 21 feet. (In case you didn't know, Jack, that would be a world record.) The ease with which characters and words may be erased, typed over and inserted is a marvel to anyone who has never seen it before. Of course, we have not touched on the more esoteric functions such as block movement, string search, and string replacement, all of which are common to even the most elementary word processing systems.

Word processors have another thing going for them. In my case, I could never compose directly on a typewriter. I had to write my opus in long hand, correct it, type it, correct it again, and finally type the final copy. I was not exactly the Carl Lewis of writing.

The computer, contrary to the usual image of a cold machine, is friendly in its word processing function. When you mistype, you don't have to roll up the paper, painstakingly white out or erase, roll back the paper being careful you have not misaligned, and type in the correct letter or word. All this while the brooding typewriter is saying you FOOL, you. It got a lot of chances to call me a fool. The computer doesn't care about mistakes. You can insert, reinsert, desert, whatever makes your clock tick.

And so we arrive at ELECTRIC PENCIL. It is simple, and inexpensive. The last I knew it was selling for \$80. It was my first word processor, and I still think well of it. If you write personal letters, lessons, and small amounts of text, ELECTRIC PENCIL is all you need.

If you don't want to put in time learning complicated systems, ELECTRIC PENCIL is for you. When I got it, I spent an hour reading the manual, propped it up, open to page 17 where the commands are, and started to work. I never could get it to number pages as it is supposed to do, but didn't especially care because I was mostly writing one page letters. It has an underline facility that I never used because the manual advises you that it's difficult.

The feature that I especially liked with ELECTRIC PENCIL was the erase to end of line function. PENCIL is not

an editor as SCRIPTSIT is. It may be used with cassette tapes, a handy feature for some people.

In short, you don't have to be handy with computers, or clever at following instructions. With PENCIL you can be at work like a professional within an hour.

AUK'SCFS--A REVIEW

After word processing, the most popular and useful programs for microcomputers are data processors. In the last issue I reviewed PROFILE, a somewhat limited but very solid Radio Shack property. The same cannot be said for AUK'S.

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AUK'S was reviewed in a recent issue of BYTE. The reviewer was scathing in his criticism, and I think he was wrong. The concept of AUK'S is not bad. It is written largely in Basic, with a lightening fast machine language sort. It is screen oriented and has some excellent features, such as a mailing list program, and the ability to perform mathematics on the fields.

The trouble is, it just doesn't work. It bombs constantly. The BYTE reviewer said disdainfully that the only recommendation was that it only cost \$20. Wrong. I don't think he ran the program. If it doesn't work, it isn't worth \$20. Another member of SBUG whose anonymity I shall preserve so that he may not be sued for slander, has told me that AUK'S has been around selling junk for a long time.

I reviewed this data base program at this time, because it has a large ad in 80MICRO. If you feel that it's worth your time going through the code to find the errors and eliminate them, it might be worth your time. Might.

Next month I'll review NOTEBOOK which was advertised as "The ultimate scratchpad".

Quite often now, I seriously think about updating my obsolete TRS 80 model I to a new machine. I have set some criteria I would like to share with you.

There are some features my new machine must have:

1. CHEAP
2. Relatively state of the art
3. Great color graphics for CAD
4. Vast hardware and software supports.

Based on those criteria, TRS 80 (I,III,4) seem to be dead end road. No more hardware and software are being designed for them recently. Now the world belongs to MSDOS and IBM compatible and most of them of not very expensive. The price is going down drastically every day

In a very competitive and rapidly changing market, computers become obsolete at a painfully hi speed, draining down the tube almost all our investment. Just consider the TRS 100 of a year ago. Most important software now requires at least 128K of Ram (not bank switching type) and also requires a 16 bit CPU or higher. Plus some experience in 16 bit machine can make you more valuable on the market if some day U have to rely on it to make a decent living. After some exhausting research, I decided not to rush for a model 4 but to hang on to my Model I until Radio Shack lowers the price on its 2000 (it will, since IBM already has lowered it microcomputers to an acceptable price.

This is only my personal opinion but I am willing to receive advice from all of you.

PS: there is a fundamental difference between a student and a working man/woman: We, students, have to pay to work.
